Spiritual Development of Congregations



The Bible gives very little information about the structures of congregations. It does give very clear pictures of what we are to be as the "people of God" and of how we are to relate to God. The following list, from New Testament letters to churches, is representative (though not exhaustive) of the qualities expected of congregations.
